

Local SEO Checklist

Printable self-audit for local visibility, citations, reviews, and lead capture. Use it per location for the clearest diagnosis.



Scan for the full guide

Google Business Profile

Your Google Maps listing. These checks impact Map Pack visibility and conversion directly.

- Primary category matches your core service (avoid broad catch-all categories).
- Services / products reflect real offerings (no keyword lists).
- Name, phone, hours, website URL, and service areas are accurate.
- Address rules are correct (storefront vs service-area business).
- Photos are current (team, jobs, storefront, before/after where relevant).
- Description reads naturally and matches what you actually do.
- Q&A is answered; duplicates or wrong listings are addressed.
- Posts/offers cadence exists (even light) to show freshness.
- Website link uses UTM tracking (optional) so leads can be measured.

Citations & NAP consistency

Clean data reduces confusion and helps search engines connect your entity across the web.

- One "source of truth" document exists for NAP, hours, categories, and URLs.
- Top citations match the source of truth (no old phone numbers/addresses).
- Duplicate listings are identified and removed/merged.
- Directories used are relevant (avoid mass low-quality submissions).
- Ownership / access is stored (logins, claim status, notes).

Website (local pages + on-page SEO)

Your site confirms relevance, supports conversion, and helps you own organic "service + city" intent.

- Each location has a useful page with clear NAP (not a copy-paste template).
- Service pages explain what you do, who it's for, and where you serve.
- Internal links connect services and locations in a logical structure.
- Calls-to-action are visible (call, form, booking) and tracking is in place.
- LocalBusiness schema is present and consistent with real business data.
- Pages are indexable (no accidental noindex, blocked resources, or broken canonicals).
- Mobile usability and speed are good enough for lead capture.
- Proof blocks exist: photos, reviews, process, and service details per location.

Reviews & trust

Reviews are both a ranking signal (prominence) and a conversion asset.

- A review acquisition flow exists (SMS/email/QR) and follows platform policies.
- You respond to reviews (positive and negative) with a consistent brand voice.
- Recent reviews show activity (freshness) and mention services naturally.
- Review links are easy to find for staff and customers (low friction).
- Reviews and testimonials are used on key pages to improve conversions.
